We, educators, parents, and children, have gone through challenging times, an unknown future, anxiety, and fright. Surprisingly enough, our children demonstrated courage and the ability to recover quickly from troublesome times. Our team has embraced the saying that *"Courage is not the absence of fear, but rather the judgment that something else is more important than fear"*. Thus, the ongoing decision to refocus everyone towards academic achievement and personal development.

Thanks to our leaders and the dedication and hard work of our regional academic team and teachers, we managed to seal the learning gaps, complete the final exams, and finalize term 1 just before winter vacation. As our mission is to help all students achieve their full potential, prepare them for success in college, equip them with the ability and desire for lifelong learning, and strengthen their civic, ethical and moral values, we will ensure that this year's learning will be as effective and as comprehensive as previous peaceful years.

On the SABIS Students Life Organization® (SLO®) front, our students, regardless of several setbacks, have been active and innovative. The eight departments have worked diligently alongside one another to create a memorable term.

The Academic department selected and trained this year's MUN delegation. They also worked hand in hand with staff members to create "order of operations" that aimed at helping grade 4 students solve mathematical equations to heal a patient. Since safety comes first, the Discipline department held a bullying prevention campaign to highlight undesirable behaviors in our school. The Management department ensured that all SLO® prefects were trained and fit for their selected role. The Sports and Health department added a sense of friendly competition through the ping-pong and football tournaments. Joy was brought to all students on campus through the Activities and Outreach departments; students were able to enjoy their first day of school, a talent show and a memorable Christmas week. The Outreach department assigned as usual, an ambassador for all new students to welcome them and make them feel at ease within their new environment. They also celebrated World Teacher's Day with students conveying their appreciation to their teachers' hard work, and instated Motivational Monday by placing quotes up for inspiration and motivation.

This term our Social responsibility department focused on helping the environment. They started the year with "lights out" campaign in which the school experienced a day without the usage of light that amazingly enough reduced our electrical consumption by 560 kw/day, enough to power 11,200 lightbulbs for 1 hour. They also created a bake sale that raised enough money to be able to replant 100 trees in an area devastated by fire. As a continuous effort to give back to our society, both staff and the Social responsibility department were able to gather over 100 gifts to put a smile on the face of children facing adversity.

The Lower school department has introduced the concept of prefects in grades 1, 2, and 3. The students showed a lot of excitement and dedication toward the tasks at hand and this created a smooth flow in the classrooms. This new sense of responsibility made the students feel proud of themselves and their achievements. Students were also introduced to few breathing techniques in which they were given fun ways to breathe properly in order to calm down when stressed, nervous, or mad. The response was outstanding, and students were able to efficiently use the breathing techniques during their exams and during playtime to focus their energy on the present and release the stress.

Finally, I would like to congratulate our graduating class of 2018-2019. A large number of them successfully started their journey in leading universities around the globe. In the U.S., this includes The University of California, Penn State, University of Scranton, Michigan State and HULT International Business School; over \$117,500 were awarded in scholarships for academic excellence. In the United Kingdom, our students are continuing their learning at University College London (UCL) for Pre-Med, ranked number nine worldwide, and Kings College London. In Canada, some of our students are attending the University of Toronto for Engineering, ranked number one in Canada, and Concordia University.

I am certain that moving forward our list of success stories will grow even larger this year especially that we have started preparing and training our students for SABIS® STARS, an event in which we nurture and identify talents in many different areas.

I am looking forward to an excellent, peaceful, and safe Term 2.

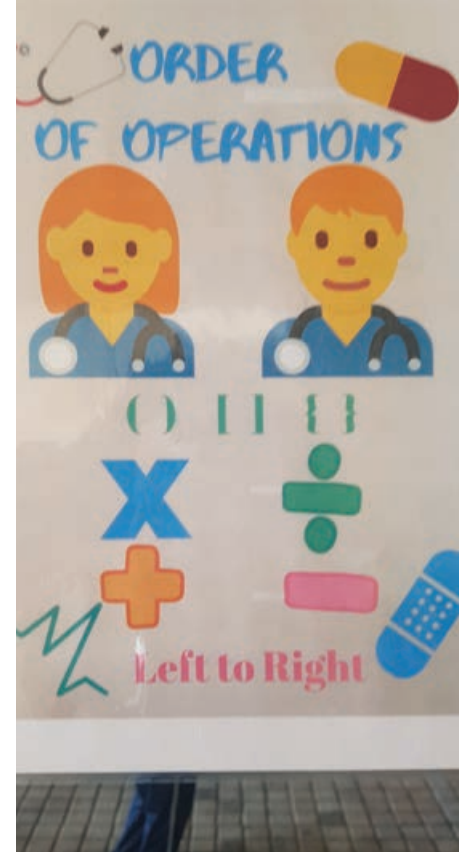

It was an amazing activity where we had the opportunity to act as doctors; we had to solve math problems to save the patients' lives. I felt very happy to be a part of this activity.

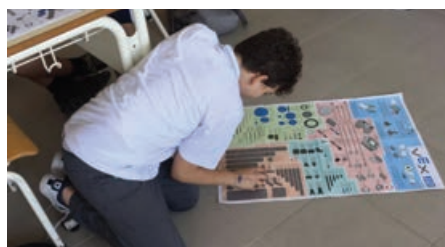

Grade 2 Trip to Bioland

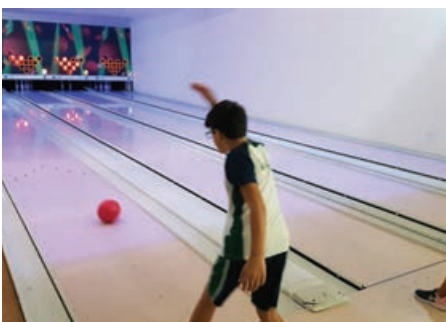

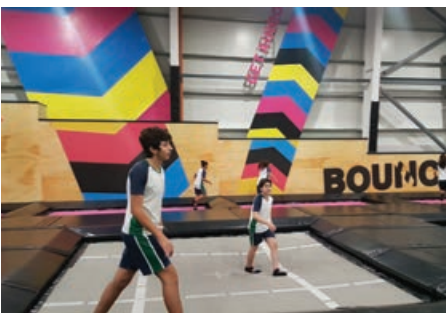

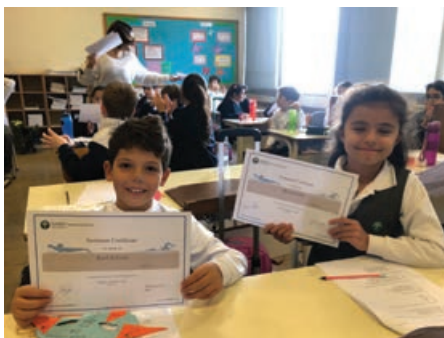
